Sailing the Adriatic Sea

I went on a great Road Scholar trip in April 2018 to Croatia and Montenegro. We spent time on land and on a 135-ft. sailing ship. I arrived in Dubrovnik, Croatia in the afternoon after a very long travel day with plane changes in Chicago and Munich, where I met up with a friend from Massachusetts. From

Dubrovnik we took a car service 40 minutes south to a beachfront hotel in Igalo, Montenegro. We had arrived a day early to get over the worst of jet lag and I'm glad we did. I spent a good part of the next day napping until we joined our trip leader, Jana, and the rest of the 16 people on the trip. Jana, who is Slovenian, was a wonderful trip leader — she knew so much about the former Yugoslavian countries and her English was perfect.



In Montenegro we visited the beautiful Bay of Kotor and learned all about that region. Then we headed to the walled Old Town Dubrovnik, where some of the

outdoor scenes of Game of Thrones were filmed. The heartier ones in the group walked on top of the walls all around Old Town, which dates back to Roman times. The Old Town was filled with shops and restaurants. We had a guided tour and a lovely lunch in a restaurant away from the crowds.

We then boarded our sailing ship MS Barbara for a 5-day trip up the Adriatic (using the motor almost all the time), docking in a different place every day. The coast of Croatia and Montenegro is a popular resort area frequented mostly by Europeans looking for a less costly but upscale vacation. In each port a local guide showed us around and discussed the history of the area. Speakers and entertainers were brought onto the ship while in port. We ended our journey in Split, Croatia where we spent two nights in a hotel and returned home from there.

tables in the dining room were bolted down and the chairs tethered so they couldn't leave the table. Thank goodness for seasickness medications.



All touring on the continent was done by boarding a small Zodiac boat and making a "wet" landing on



shore. We were provided heavy coats and knee-high boots to keep us dry during the landings. The penguins feed mainly on a diet of krill. They efficiently turn these small sea creatures into a foul smelling mess that takes some time to get used to.


The weather ranged from almost white out snow conditions to brilliant sunshine. Temperatures in the
